1 Pat Armstrong was in her forties when she swapped her secretary's typewriter for a potter's wheel. The vessels she now throws are classical in form and raku-glazed. This Japanese technique involves removing the pot from the kiln when the glaze is molten, covering it in sawdust and immersing it in cold water, causing a crackle effect.
